## Personal Reflections on the Value of Music Camp

Plans and preparations for the July 15-19, 2024 Summer Music Camp at the Franciscan Center have been underway for several months and we have often provided you with information. But I need to share some reflections about why I want you to seriously consider attending music camp this summer. What follows is a personal reflection of what music camp meant and did for me many years ago. (The following was taken from Sister Carol Ann's Facebook post)

My camp experiences as a developing French horn player were of tremendous value during my formative years in middle school and high school. Where do I begin? Attending music camp was LIFECHANGING for me! After the first summer of attending camp, I was completely hooked and could hardly wait until the next summer. Classes, sectionals and rehearsals provided new educational concepts to learn, exposure to new repertoire and mentorship from camp staff and instructors. Truly lifelong friendships with other campers and instructors were formed. Going to music camp helped me define what I wanted to do with the rest of my life which was to pursue a career in music. The path to pursuing a musical career became the means in which God called me to become a Sister. But, that is a whole other long story.

### Personal Reflections continued...

Back to music camp reflections. It was through the Director of the Camp and many of the camp instructors that I received insights about where to attend college and how to prepare for college. One important piece of advice I received at one of the summer camps was to seek private lessons on the French horn at Lawrence Music Conservatory. One summer I was over the moon excited to win the top prize at the Honors recital. This meant a full scholarship to return the next summer and at that time winning was a huge affirmation in my musical journey. For me music camp was a shot in the arm of motivation to set personal goals, become a stronger musician, grow as leader in my high school music classes, practice more, enjoy and love music which resulted in increased self-esteem and confidence.

Reflecting back on my varied experiences as a camper, I was very blessed to be a part of a musical village where dedicated music teachers offered me guidance, mentorship, encouragement and excellent advice.

Becoming a caring person and collaborative musician during a camp experience is the most valuable gift that any person can take home to their schools, churches and families. ### July 15-19 Camp Together Includes...

**PIANO ENSEMBLES** ~ Camp piano ensembles are group sessions where piano players come together to play music. In ensembles, they learn to play with each other and recognize the importance of each member for a successful performance. These sessions help students develop self-confidence, social skills, discipline, and teamwork. Playing music is fun, interesting, and beneficial!

MUSICIANSHIP CLASSES ~ Camp classes play a crucial role in a musician's development. Musicianship goes beyond technical instrument skills. It's about understanding and owning your music, learning about the background of music, transforming you from a player to a true musician. Musicianship involves internalizing rhythm, training your ears, and brain to identify notes. Remember, musicianship is the bedrock of your musical journey, fine-tuning your skills and making everything else easier

**ENSEMBLE (STRING OR WIND)** ~ Playing in both wind or string ensembles offers unique benefits. Ensemble playing teaches collaboration and the art of blending individual sounds into a cohesive whole. Wind musicians learn to listen actively to their peers, adjusting their playing based on what they hear. This skill is essential for ensemble cohesion. Ensemble players work together, hitting the same notes simultaneously while observing tempo and dynamics. This fosters teamwork and leadership skills. In summary, both wind and string ensembles offer social, emotional, and physical advantages. Whether you're drawn to woodwinds, brass, or strings, ensemble playing enriches your musical journey!

**HANDBELL ENSEMBLE** ~ In our camp educational setting, handbells serve as an excellent tool for teaching music theory and teamwork. Because each player is generally responsible for specific notes, participants learn to read music, count rhythms, and listen for cues from other ensemble members. It also fosters teamwork and coordination skills.

**CHOIR** ~ Singing in the camp choir offers numerous benefits for both physical and mental well-being. Being part of camp choir helps enhance vocal abilities and musicality. Singing allows singers to express emotions and relieve stress and singing positively impacts self-confidence and overall well-being. It's an excellent way to meet new friends and expand your social circles. Collaborating in a choir fosters teamwork and cooperation. Above all, it's just pure enjoyment!


