Please welcome a new piano instructor, Mrs. Beth Schultz!

Beth Schulz has been an avid lover of music all her life. She plays the piano, flute and sings. Beth is a Green Bay native, graduating from Preble High School. After obtaining her Master's Degree in Speech Language Pathology (with a minor in music), Beth started her 26-year career as a speech language therapist in the public schools. During this time, Beth devoted much time to sharing her musical skills with Solo and Ensemble students as piano accompanist. She performed with rock 'n roll dance bands in the 1990's playing for weddings and social gatherings. Beth also played in pit bands for various high school musicals. After taking early retirement from the Public Schools, Beth decided to pursue her career in music. She enrolled in the music program at UWGB, with a piano focus. She studied four years under the direction of concert pianist Dr. Michael Rector. She graduated in 2018 and has been teaching piano students of all ages for the past four years. When opportunity presents, she still performs with ensembles, show choirs and college students. Beth is excited to be a part of the Holy Family Conservatory of Music this Fall.

Born in the Dominican Republic, Rissel and her family moved to the United States in 2001. Although a singer her entire life, Rissel began piano lessons at the age of 15. In 2017, she graduated from the University of Wisconsin Green Bay with a Bachelor of Arts in Music, studying under Dr Michael Rector and Dr John Salerno. As a composer, arranger, recording artist, producer, and manager, Rissel's projects include four albums of original music, working with her partner Matthew Hillman, jazz guitar professor at UWGB, and The Band Pegasis, which includes her partner and her two sisters, Marvelis and Yaina.

Pegasis was recently nominated for a WAMI (Wisconsin Artist Music Industry) for Best Latin/Funk band, and also performed at Oshkosh's first Jazz Festival, sharing the stage with artists such as Joey DeFrancesco and Haley Reinhart. Pegasis was also invited to perform their original music at the Weidner Center for the Performing Arts. Rissel teaches private piano and voice lessons, is the pianist at Green Bay Trinity Lutheran Church, is the collaborative pianists for many choirs in the Fox Valley Area, including a recent tenure at the Lawrence Academy of Music Girl Choir. She has performed with many ensembles and artists including the Green Bay Civic Symphony, Mark Wood of the Transiberian Orchestra, and Steve March-Tormé, to name a few. Rissel is proud of her diverse background and thanks her parents for instilling in her a love for music. She loves to talk about anything so feel free to say hi!


Dear Students!

Music for Tots[™] program is back! Fall semester: September 28-December 3



Tots from birth to age five are enrolled in a ten-week music class each semester, Fall and Spring. Each class is limited to eight children of the same general age.

Parents and teachers involved in the Music for Tots[™] program offered through Holy Family Conservatory of Music readily affirm that participation in these music classes improves not only the tonal, listening, rhythmic and coordination skills of the children, but their verbal and socialization skills as well as their ability to follow directions, focus attention, and share with their peers. Above all, music classes teach the child how to sing and enriches their lives for a lifetime!

Music for Tots[™] classes offer 30-minute classes for children from infancy to three years of age, and 40-minute classes for older threes, fours and fives. Parents participate with their children in classes for infants and toddlers. In the transition age of three, the children become more independent. In classes of three-and-a-half to five-year-old, the preschoolers participate in songs, rhythm games and activities independently, with parents present but not actively involved.
